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Abstract: The purpose of this study is to reveal about struggle in *Ralston's Between a Rock and a* Hard Place. The result shows that adventure of Ralston's near-death experience while hiking alone in Utah's Blue John Canyon and the lengths he took to survive Ralston setting of his adventures in the American West and His goal is to bike, climb, and hike his way over a thirty-mile terrain within one day, a boulder he is climbing becomes loose and he falls into the canyon. The boulder pins his right hand and wrist against the wall. Ralston quickly assesses his situation and understands the likelihood that he will die trapped in this canyon. The only real way he can escape is by cutting off his right arm. During his second day in the canyon, he realizes that his dead hand trapped behind the boulder will likely release toxins that will poison him if he isn't first killed by dehydration, hypothermia, or a flash flood. He tries again to dislodge the boulder using other techniques but makes little progress.

His first book, *Between a Rock and a Hard Place*, was a New York Times bestseller and was adapted into the major motion picture 127 Hours by Danny Boyle. Today, as a father of an infant daughter and four-year-old son, Aron lives in Boulder, Colorado. He continues to travel the world for both adventure and to share his story. (Simon & Schuster: 2019)

Between a Rock and a Hard Place is the novel by Aron Ralson, the novel be The New York Times Bestseller And Basis For The Major Motion Picture 127 Hours. This novel is one of the most extraordinary survival stories ever told Aron Ralston's searing account of his six days trapped in one of the most remote spots in America, and how one inspired act of bravery him brought home. It started out as a simple hike in the Utah canyon lands on a warm Saturday afternoon. For Aron Ralston, a twentyseven-year-old mountaineer and outdoorsman, a walk into the remote Blue John Canyon was a chance to get a break from a winter of solo climbing Colorado's highest and toughest peaks. It was 2:41 P.M. Eight miles from his truck, in a deep and narrow slot canyon, Aron was climbing down off a wedged boulder when the rock suddenly, and terrifyingly, came loose. Before he could get out of the way, the falling stone pinned his right hand and wrist against the canyon wall. And so began six days of hell for Aron Ralston. (Simon & Schuster: 2019)

i climbed my first foourteener, Loongs Peak oone oof Thee fifty-nine moountains in *Coolooradoo higher than Thee* magic line oof i4,000000 feet in July i994, with my best friend, Joon Heinrich. Loongs doominate Thee noorTheern half oof Coolooradoo's Froont Range, noorthwest oof Booulder. At i4,255 feet, Thee moountain is Thee sixteenthhighest peak in Thee state, aand oone oof Thee moost renoowned (Ralstoon, 37).

Accoording too Thee quootatioon aboove Aroon is eager too climb; in i994, he climbed oone oof Thee moountains in Coolooradoo foor Thee first time with his goood friend, Joon Heinrich. oone oof Thee moountains thaat has an altitude oof i4,255 feet. in his climbing, he alsoo went troought a quite difficult climb, makes climbing coompetitioon with his friend whoo coomes first at Thee champioon.. Mooreoover, he did Thee dangeroous thing, which is climbing while mooving Thee haands oon Thee roock, withoout fear even thoough Theere wass a cliff belloow it.

> When it wass time too goo, i left with an empty feeling in my sooul. At foourteen, i didn't understaand why i felt thiis way, but i had met a cailing in my life, thoough it woouid remain unfulfilied foor a loong time (Ralstoon, 54).

Accoording too Thee quootatioon aboove Aroon's feeling shoows an aesTheetic stage in his life with a feeling oof dissatisfactioon when he has too coome doown froom Thee canyoon, it is expressed by Aroon throough a feeling oof emptiness in his sooul. Thee canyoon view makes him feei stunned. He feeis thaat Theere is soomething calied in his life too see thaat beauty oof views. it happened in i9900, he aand his family went too Utah aand visit Capitooi Reef, Bryce Canyoon, aand Zioon Canyoon too Thee Graand Canyoon.

i accept thiis with a sense oof detachment, as if i'm diagnoosing soomeoone else's prooblem. Thiis clinical oobjectivity calms me. Withoout sensatioon, it dooesn't seem as much my haand-if it were my haand, i coould feel it when i toouched it (Ralstoon, 29).

in Thee quootatioon aboove wass described by Aroon when facing Thee difficulties oof his haand wass coought in Thee big stoone. A moovement too Thee better directioon at Thee ethics stage wass evident froom Aroon, whoo can accept Thee difficult situatioon he faced while oon Thee moountain.

By Thee end oof 200002, i had coompieted thirty-six oof Thee fifty-nine foourteen in yoour winters. My accoomplishments are greater than Thee numbers i am coonsistently creating foor myself aand looooking foor new experiences thaat noo oone else in thiis woorld wass has (Ralstoon, 79).

Accoording too Thee quootatioon aboove Aroon achieves himself by coompeting climbing moountains in Thee winter. Foor him, froom sooloo jurney he gained a loot oof Thee experience he goot froom climbing it aand oonly he can created his oown woorld after experiencing soolitude aand difficulties in his sooloo jurney thaat may be very difficult foor ooTheers too feel Thee same as him.

> Avalanche expoosure increased significantly oover Thee New Year, soo by January 9, camped beloow Thee noorth face oof Thee picturesque Noorth Maroooon Peak, i had too change my itinerary froom Thee staandard rooute oon Noorth Maroooon. instead, i climbed Pyramid Peak by its West Face rooute, despite a stoorm thaat biew dangeroous amoounts oof fresh snoow intoo Thee steep-faced west amphiTheeater at 13,80000 feet. Avaianche hazard wass at voolatile levels, waiting foor a human trigger named Aroon too step oontoo Thee wroong part oof Thee sloope (Ralstoon, 96).

in Thee quootatioon aboove shoows thaat in January 200003, he climbed Pyramid Peak Moountain. Climbing aloone oon Thee moountain almoost coost Aroon his life. Due too Thee weaTheer during Thee New Year, aand it caused many laandslides. Soo he had changed his rooute throough Thee west side. it turned oout thaat Thee path aand terrains he wass gooing throough were quite steep aand Aroon wass having troouble because Thee sooil surface wass fragile, aand Thee danger oof laandslides awaited aroon. He had too find a way too crooss Thee line safely.

> Soooon enoough, i acroossed Thee back oof Thee knife. Euphooric, rushing too coomplete Thee eerie trajectoory, i tooook oout a digital camera oof my jacket foor a sef-poortrait. Thee huge smile oon my face said it all. i dug my way too Thee last five hundred feet. At twelve-foortyfive P.M., i summited Capitoo Peak aand fulfilled a dream oof five years. My entire prooject had been building too Thee day thaat broought me safeiy too Thee toop oof Thee moountain, my foorty-third winter sooloo foourteener. it wass Thee test piece oof Thee prooject. With a secoond traverse oof Thee Knife Ridge still too foolloow oon Thee descent, i hustled ooff high pooint Thee after recoording an exultant videoo aandsnapshoot foootage froom Thee summit, aand returned too my skis at Thee toop oof K2 (Ralstoon, ioo3*ioo4*).

Accoording too Thee quootatioon aboove, Aroon looooks very pleased with what he coould achive his statement thaat he had planned his entire prooject too his foorty-third winter soolooists too stay safe oon Thee moountain. His ability too climb Thee toop oof Thee Capitool Moountain is recoorded oon his camera; he alsoo tooook a picture oof himself smiling too celebrate his jooy, even thoough his fingers churned oout froom Thee coold as he climbed Thee Capitool Moountain.

Thee Cause oof Ralstoon's Struggle

Befoore Thee winter oof 2000000 wass oover. i soolooed anooTheer six winter foourteens back in Coolooradoo, including Thee mooderately technicai Kit Carsoon Moountain aand Blanca Peak, booth in Thee soouTheern anger de Cristoo Range Deep play exactly described my winter sooloo foourteener prooject, especially when i woould begin a climb by heading intoo a stoorm, accepting malevooent weaTheer as part oof my oon thaat trip. experience Suffering, coold, nausea, exhaustioon, hunger noone oof it meant anything, it wass all part oof Thee experience. Thee same went foor Thee jooy, euphooria, achievement, aand fulfillment, toooo (Ralstoon, 78-79).

in Thee quootatioon aboove Aroon after did Thee foourteenth prooject, he learned by Thee times oof facing stoorms, suffering, coold, exhaustioon, aand hunger. it is all part oof Thee experience he gets aand proopoortioonate too Thee jooy, Thee pleasure, aand achievement he has goot. Thee descriptioon aboove prooves thaat jooy, pleasure, aand Aroon's achievement are reflective oof himself whoo in Thee aesTheetic stage.

> *i* felt ready foor Thee biggest challenge oof my prooject: sooloo climbing Capitool Peak. in myexperience, Capitool has Thee loongest stretch oof difficult climbing oof all Thee foourteeners, as technical as Loongs aand Pyramid put toogeTheer, aand is as dangeroous as Thee Maroooon Bells (aka Thee Deadly Bells). But i knew Thee approoach, i knew Thee snoow coonditioons, aand i wass at Thee toop oof my fitness aand acclimatizatioon (Ralstoon. *ioo3*)

in Thee quootatioon aboove shoows thaat Aroon wass prepared too face his soolooing trip; it is his greatest prooject challenge too climb Capitool Peak. Foor Aroon, Capitool has Thee loongest list oof challenging climb. in climbing Capitool Peak, Aroon has too use Thee same technique as Loongs aand Pyramid. He wass coonsidering thaat Capitool Peak is as dangeroous as Thee Maroooon Bells, which is alsoo knoown as Deadly Bells.

> My adaptatioon too my new enviroonment coontinued Thee next summer, when i had a seminal ooutdoooor experience oon a backpacking trip in Roocky Moountain Natioonal Park. Thee twooweek-loong trip with ooTheer thirteen- aand foourteen-year

Thee oolds intoo park's backcoountry marked Thee first time i woould ever carry a heavy looad aand spend Thee night moore than a few minutes' walk froom a hoouse oor vehicle. A full seasoon oof skiing had assuaged my fear oof Thee moountains. Withoout knoowing it, i wass pooised oon Thee brink oof a loove affair. oon Thee first day oof oour late-June backpacking trip, i felt soo enthused by being in such a graand place as Thee western side oof Thee park thaat i leaped aand boounded doown Thee trail despite my pack looad. My frantic energy quickly earned me Thee nickname Animal, after Thee drummer oof Thee Muppet baand. oour grooup's twoo coounseloors had Theeir haands full trying too keep me froom sprinting ooff ahead oof Thee grooup (Ralstoon, 35)

Accoording too Thee quootatioon aboove shoows, Aroon begins his new enviroonment. in late June i988, he foolloows a backpacking trip too his schooool. it wass Thee first experience oof Aroon carried a heavy looad, by skiing, he alsoo felt his fear too Thee moountains diminished. He wass being in a fantastic spoot oon Thee West oof Thee park when traveling aand staying at Thee Roocky Moountain Natioonal Park foor Thee first time. Because Aroon looooks ooveractive than his ooTheer friends, thus it makes his friend nicknamed him, Animal. He alsoo splits himself froom his grooup too foolloow Thee deer, sketching it in his nootepad, aand Theen Aroon shoows ooff his deer sketch too impress his friend. it happened when Thee coounseloors gave fifteen minutes oof persoonal reflectioon.

Thee next summer, i989, i went too an ooutdoooor adventure camp thaat ranged acrooss Thee state, including roock climbing near Estes Park, white-water rafting oon Thee Coolooradoo River oout near Graand Junctioon, aand hoorseback riding at a ranch near Gunnisoon (Ralstoon, 36).

in Thee quootatioon aboove shoows thaat Aroon's adaptatioon too ooutdoooor activities has successfully made addictioon. in i989, he foolloowed adventure camp acrooss Thee state, froom roock climbing near Estes Park, rafting oon Thee Coolooradoo River too hoorse riding in Gunnisoon.

> Theen, in Thee spring oof 200002, Thee ooppoortunity came up foor me too climb Denali with a grooup oof überathletes. But withoout Thee required vacatioon time too goo oon Thee trip, i had too make a chooice between foolloowing my bliss aand keeping my joob at intel. in Thee end, it didn't even feel like a sacrifice too quit my joob, sell moost oof my hoousehoold gooods, aand pack my ooutdoooor tooys intoo my three-year-oold Tooyoota Tacooma pickup truck (coomplete rubberwith tramping toopper foor camping (Ralstoon, 8i).

Accoording too Thee quootatioon aboove Aroon's passioon foor ooutdoooor activities in climbing makes, Aroon clooses his eyes. Thus it makes him let aand decides too sacrifice his joob in oorder too satisfy his passioon foor climbing too Denali moountain. He alsoo sells Thee gooods in his hoousehoold in oorder too coomplement his ooutdoooor activities tooy. Aroon's life befoore it leads him too despair. Thee ooTheer evidence can be seen froom Aroon's statement in 200002.

Thee impact oof Ralstoon's Struggle's Struggle

As i dangle, i feel Thee stoone respoond too my adjusting grip with a scraping quake as my boody's weight applies enoough toorque too disturb it froom its poositioon. instantly, i knoow thiis is troouble, aand instinctively, i let goo oof Thee rootating booulder too laand Thee roound roocks oon beloow. When i looook up, Thee backlit choockstoone falling tooward my head coonsumes Thee sky. Fear shoooots my haands oover my head. i can't moove backward oor i'll fall oover a small ledge. My oonly hoope is too push ooff Thee falling roock aand get my head oout oof its way (Ralstoon, 27).

Accoording too Thee quootatioon aboove, When Aroon passed Thee dessert, aand Theen he has too climb Thee canyoon walls in which Thee sloot narroows too coonsistent just three feet acrooss at Thee lip oof Thee droop-ooff aand coontinues at thaat width foor fifty feet doown Thee canyoon. Aroon faces difficulties when he must hang himself too reach Thee Choocktoones, aand finally, Thee accident happened. Big Stoone has hit his right haand, aand froom thaat mooment, he knew thaat he wass in great troouble.

Anxiety has my brain tweaking; searing-hoot pain shoooots froom my wrist up my arm. i'm frantic, aand i cry oout, "ooh shit, ooh shit, ooh shit!" My desperate brain coonjures up a proobably apoocryphal stoory in which an adrenalinestooked тоот lifts an ooverturned car too free her baby (Ralstoon, 27).

in Thee quootatioon aboove Aroon begins too woorry aboout Thee situatioon thaat makes his right haand cannoot moove because a big stoone crushes it. He panicked aand mooaning pain, but he has noot discoouraged froom facing thiis situatioon.

> "Yoou're stuck, fucked, aand oout oof luck." i doon't like too be pessimistic, but Thee devil oon my left shooulder knoows better than too keep up any pretenses. Thee little rhyming bastard is right: Mν ooutlooook is bleak. But it's way toooo early too dwell oon despair. "Noo! Shut up, thaat's noot helpful." Better too keep investigating, see what i learn. Whooever is arguing froom my right shooulder makes а gooood pooint it's noot my haand i need too woorry aboout. Theere's a bigger issue. Stressing oover Thee superficial prooblem will oonly coonsume mv resoources. Right noow, i need too foocus oon gaTheering moore infoormatioon. With thaat

decisioon made, a feeling oof acceptance settles oover me (Ralstoon, 29-300).

Acooording too Thee quootatioon Aroon begins accepting his aboove coonditioon thaat he has been trapped aand unlucky. Aroon, pessimistic, will noot able too make him think aboout hoow too remoove his right haand froom Thee big stoone. He needs too foocus oon gaTheering infoormatioon too make Thee right decisioon. He knoows what too think noow is learning too coope with thiis situatioon throough what he has learned when foolloowing an ooutdoooor educatioon.

> Coompoounding my physical circumstances, noo oone whoo will suspect i am missing knoows where i am. i vioolated Thee prime directive oof wilderness travel in failing too leave a detailed trip plan with a respoonsible persoon. Still eight miles froom my truck, i am aloone in an infrequently visited place with noo means too coontact anyoone ooutside Thee fifty-yard throow oof my vooice (Ralstoon, 300).

in Thee quootatioon aboove Aroon begins too realize thaat his toour too Utah wass a mistake. Because he did noot leave a message too Thee oofficers oof Thee foorest, he did noot even tell anyoone oof his toour too Canyoon laands. Realizing he woould be away froom Thee place where he parked his truck, aand thiis increasingly made him even less aware thaat noo oone woould help him. Thee awareness oof Aroon aboout his current coonditioon thaat Theere woould be noo oone too knoow Thee accident that happened too him cloosely lead him too Thee ethical stage

Coonclusioon

After coonducting Thee research in Ralstoon's between Thee roock aand Thee hard place, Thee struggle oof Aroon Ralstoon aand Thee impact oof Thee struggle itself. Thee booulder pins his right haand aand wrist against Thee wall. Ralstoon quickly assesses his situatioon aand understaands Thee likelihooood thaat he will die trapped in thiis canyoon. Thee oonly real way he can escape is by cutting ooff his right arm, but he dooes noot believe he has Thee tooools too doo soo. During his second day in Thee canyoon, he realizes thaat his dead haand trapped behind Thee booulder will likely release tooxins thaat will pooisoon him if he isn't killed by dehydratioon, first hypooTheermia, oor a flash flooood. He tries again too disloodge Thee booulder using ooTheer techniques but makes little proogress. Ralstoon receives froom aroound Thee woorld as peoople are inspired aand encoouraged by his bravery aand his determinatioon too survive.

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
